### To Members and to Residents About Lake Wawasee

Dear Sir:

Though this appeal will be sent to members of the Wawasee Protective Association, it is more particularly addressed to those who either own property on Lake Wawasee or are annual visitors at that Lake. It is these parties who are vitally interested in the welfare of Wawasee Lake and all that pertains to it.

There are many things needed and many things that should be done at Wawasee, but all these various things cannot be done at once, though some ought to be and should be done immediately. What we urgently need and MUST HAVE before the Summer season of 1912 opens, is a new up to date boat pier at the Baltimore & Ohio Depot landing. The old pier has not been sate for some years and cannot be put in shape for the coming season. A new pier must be had and also a better pier than was built some years back. This will require an expenditure of at least \$150.00, and to make this improvement there is now in the Association's Treasury about \$20.00

During the past year the membership in the Association has more than doubled; it is larger than any year since the first year of its existence, but with the annual dues reduced the income from its members remains about the same. \$300.00 has been paid toward the erection of the State Fish Hatchery and over \$100.00 on back indebtedness, leaving the treasury in its present state. At this point would like to state, a full and complete Treasurer's Report will be published and forwarded to members after annual meeting.

With the treasury in its present condition, it is evident that we will be required to increase our membership to gain more funds. This ought not to be difficult for there are many people about the Lake who are perfectly able and interested enough to pay \$5 00 for added improvements.

Must it be said of the non-members that they are willing to take advantage of the co-operation of others, use their pier, enjoy better fishing, etc., simply because they won't contribute \$5.00 annually toward maintaining some organization that intends to, in a measure, hold Wawasee inhabitants together in some banded unity?

The people of Syracuse cannot be called upoh to assist in this matter, they have all they can do to raise in the neighborhood of a thousand dollars to install an electric lighting system for the present launch channel connecting Wawasee and Syracuse Lakes. They intend to keep the channel lighted every evening from dusk until 12 or 1 o'clock at night. This is being done in view of the fact that the Railroad bridge has been raised and now all launches without canopy tops can easily get from one lake to the other without discomfiture at this formerly impassable place.

If you are not a member of this Association, this letter applies to you. There is no valid reason why you should not come to our aid unless financially unable. It may be you will not wish to use a pier at depot landing, or enjoy better fishing, but there are other ends to which your support and co-operation is needed. What will you do in this matter, or will you let others do the doing?

Kindly communicate your intentions in this matter so that you will not again be asked to contribute if you do not intend doing so. Forward your remittance of \$5.00 to me.

# Minutes Annual Meeting of Wawasee Protective Association, August 3, 1912.

As the report of Secretary had been published and a copy of same forwarded to each member the reading of same was dispensed with. Report of Treasurer was submitted, approved and the same ordered published and a copy forwarded to each member of the Association.

A general discussion was held with reference to the Wawasee Fish Hatchery and it was reported that of the 400,000 small minnows just hatched and placed in fish hatchery last spring, 150,000 to 200,000 small bass, averaging three inches in length were just recently removed from Hatchery, ½ being placed in Lake Papakeechie and ½ placed in Lake Wawasee.

It was moved and carried that thanks of Wawasee Protective Association and congratulations of the same be extended to Hon. Geo. W. Miles, Indiana Fish and Game Commissioner, for the results obtained in his first year's work at the Wawasee Fish Hatchery and throughout the state generally and that a notice of this action be drafted in proper form and forwarded to him.

The following resolution was presented, approved and copies ordered forwarded to the proper B. & O. officials, including C. H. Bachelder, Supt., and T. J. Frazier, Zanesville, Obio. Resolved: That the thanks of the Wawasee Protective Association be extended to the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad Company for the raising of its bridge over the Channel between Lake Wawasee and the Town of Syracuse.

The following resolution was presented, approved and a copy ordered sent to the President of the Syracuse Progressive Association and a copy delivered to the Syracuse Journal for publication in that paper. Resolved That the thanks of this Association be extended to the Syracuse Protective Association for its enterprise in lighting the channel connecting Lake Wawasee and Syracuse Lake on which the Town of Syracuse is situated. Pres. of said Association being present then gave a friendly talk upon the better relations established between the people of Lake Wawasee and those of the Town of Syracuse and especially mentioned that the people of Syracuse were duly appreciative of the good will of the resorters about Lake Wawasee.

The following resolution to Hon. Geo. W. Miles, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Indiana was presented and after general discussion was approved and copies of same ordered sent to Commissioner and to Fish and Game Protective Associations throughout the state. Resolved: That the Wawasee Protective Association ask a closed fishing season to be established by the State Legislature for such portions of the various lakes of the state of Indiana as shall from year to year be designated and properly marked by the State Fish Commissioner, the same to be and remain closed for such periods of each year as the Legislature shall designate, but that the same cover at least the period from March 1, to June 15th of each year. And It was Resolved: That a committee of three benamed to cooperate with the State Game and Fish Commissioner in securing the enactment of such legislation at the next session of the legislature as may be best calculated to protect the fishing in the lakes of the state. In the same, the following committee was appointed, J. A. Van Osdol, Anthony Deahl, and Geo. M. Kleeder.

The use of Association pier by non-members was discussed and it seemed the consensus of opinion that non-members be debarred from the use of the same and especially the public boatmen. The promiscuous use of boards, planks and large stakes in the setting out of trot lines was deplored as such articles are a menace to launches, every effort should be made to discourage their use.

The meeting then proceeded to the election of officers for the ensuing year. It was moved and carried that the present Board of Directors, Ellwood George, Daniel Zook, Geo. L. Xanders, J. A. Van Osdol, Rt. Rev. J. H. White, and Elliott Durand be reelected and that the Secretary be instructed to cast ballot of Association in accordance with same. It was moved and carried that Secretary be instructed to cast ballot of Association for Ellwood George as President of said Board and of said Association. It was moved and carried that the President cast the ballot of the Association for the election of Daniel Zook as Vice-President and Geo. L. Xanders as Treasurer and Secretary of said Association.

It was moved and duly carried that the Wawasee Protective Association affiliate itself with the state wide organization, known as the Indiana Fish, Game and Forest League, that the Secretary forward application and dues of \$5.00 to the same, and that the President of this Association represent the same at their next annual meeting.

Hon. Geo. W, Miles gave a short talk on his future plans as to the propagation of fish and game in the state of Indiana. He stated that it was his present plan to establish a State Fish Hatchery to supply fish to other lakes than Wawasee and Papakeechie, in the near vicinity of Lake Wawasee if he were able to obtain land for that purpose at a reasonable figure. Members present were urged to apply to Geo. M. Bower, United States Fish Commissioner at Washington, D. C., for small fish to stock Lake Wawasee, as same could be had from the Federal Fish Hatchery for the asking.

No further business appearing the meeting was adjourned.

Moved and carried that the Association obtain the services of a watchman to apprehend such parties who operate their launches without lights during the night-time and cause their arrest for the violation of the law

Resolution committee reported as follows:-to-wit:

Resolved, that the Secretary of this Association, in behalf of certain Wawasee Property holders, be instructed to notify the officers of the Sandusky Portland
Cement Co., that said Company is failing to comply with a certain contract existing between said Cement Co. and certain property holders around Wawasee lake,
in dredging marl from said Lake during the summer months, thus rendering themselves legally liable under said contract to every property holder injured by the
action of the said Cement Co. That a copy of said resolution be sent to the proper officers of the Cement Co. with a request that they give orders that will cause
the contract to be complied with; that a committee be appointed to take such action as may be necessary if the Cement Co. refuse to comply with their contract.

Resolution unanimously adopted and the following committee was appointed: Haines Egbert, Frank Remy and W. R. Park.

Moved and carried that Secretary investigate the law with regard to the placing of stakes in lake Wawasee, which are likely to cause damage to launches.

The town of Syracuse not assisting in re-digging the Pickwick channel, the matter was dropped for the time being.

In event of drowning, phone for lungmotor at Sargents hotel and pulmotor at Harkless machine shop, Syracuse. Call any doctor at Syracuse and he will procure the pulmotor from Syracuse.

A light at each end of boat will save you from arrest if you run your launch after dark.

If you observe a dangerous stake in the lake, pull it up, you will thereby do others a favor as well as yourself.

Infractions of the Fish and Game Laws, should be reported to the Secretary at once.

The Sandusky Portland Cement Co. had agreed some years back, not to dredge in Wawasee lake, during the months of June, July, August and September, except in Conklin Bay, Johnson Bay and Jarrett Bay and not at any place on Sundays or at night. Hence the action in regard to same at the annual meeting.

Mr. Geo. Berg, Supt. of hatcheries has placed this August in Wawasee lake, 4000 large mouth bass finerlings and 5000 blue gill minnows, and in Syracuse lake 1650 large mouth fingerlings.

Minutes of Annual Meeting of Wawasee Protective Association, July 13, 1918.

Meeting called to order by the President, Haines Egbert. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

The Secretary read the minutes of the annual meeting of the Indiana F.sh, Forest & Game League, held in October, 1917. The same being held in an off year, there not being a session of the State Legislature in January and February, following same, no important action was taken other than to endorse Gov. Goodrich's conservation bill, providing for the consolidation of several departments, Fish & Game being one of same, under one commission of several men.

The following were elected officers and directors, to serve for the ensuing year: Haines Egbert, President; W. M. Griffin, Vice-President; George L. Xanders, Secretary-Treasurer; George M. Kleder, W. S. Ellis and M. C. Honeywell, Directos.

The matter of garbage disposal was thoroughly discussed. It was moved and seconded that the Association communicate with the Indiana State Board of Health and request the services of an inspector to visit each cuttage around Lake Wawasee and make an inspection of same, as well as to leave at each cottage a notice stating that all garbage or refuse must be either burned or buried.

The Secretary in conjunction with the President, was instructed to write to the official head of the Sandusky Cement Company to complain of the violation of their agreement with several members of the Association, concerning the proper use of their dredge in Lake Wawssee, and to notify them that continued violation of same will make it null and void and that the Association will then bend every effort to keep them out of Lake Wawssee altogether.

At ention of Association called to the fact that short bass are being removed from the Lake and Secretary instructed to notify Fish & Game wardens of said fact.

Most of the session was devoted to discussing the road situation about the Lake. It was called to the Association's attention that the principal reason for this condition was due to the fact that the tax road money was disbursed in putting in shape other roads about the township instead of the Lake roads and that this would probably continue until there was a change in the office of Township Trustee, which same would take place on January 1, 1919. Secretary authorized to solicit the road tax money from cottagers and spend the same on the Lake roads, obtaining the proper credit on taxes for those parties, paying in the same.

Moved and carried that the next annual meeting of Association be held at Vawter Park, to-wit:—JULY 12, 1919.

No further business appearing, the meeting was duly adjourned.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY

If you have not been furnished with the Association metal sign for your cottage, please call or advise Secretary of the fact.

Between July 1, 1917, and July 1, 1918, there were 34 convictions before the local Justice of the Peace for violating the Fish & Game laws, principally fish laws, of the State of Indiana. This includes: illegal netting, undersize bass, etc. Our wardens are doing something.

Last summer there were planted by the State Fish Hatcheries located here in Syracuse and Wawasee Lake approximately 5,000 small bass, and during the past week, 3,900 three-inch bass were planted in Lake Wawasee and 1,100 in Syracuse Lake. These are unusually large and ought to survive.

The Association intends to furnish proper evidence to the Health Department of the State for parties who do not properly dispose of their garbage and refuse.
